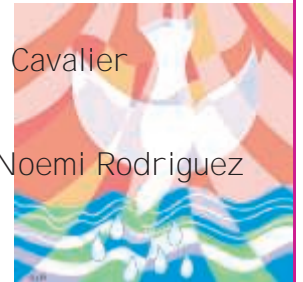

Sharing Catholic Social Teaching

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In this week's and the next six bulletins, we will highlight key themes of the seven social teachings that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition: 1. *Life and Dignity of the Human Person*, 2. *Call to Family, Community and Participation*, 3. *Rights and Responsibilities*, 4. *Option for the Poor and Vulnerable*, 5. *The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers*, 6. *Solidarity* and 7. *Care for God's Creation*.

Call to Family, Community and Participation—The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society - in economics and politics, in law and policy - directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. The family is the central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.
